## **Animal Performance:**


#### Older cattle

- The final 22 heifers on the farm are booked in to be killed on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> January; however this will depend on their BCS in January.
- The steers are doing well and remain on a restricted diet of 28kg silage and 2 kg concentrate, this will need to be amended soon as their weight increases.
- Even though conditions have been mild, the animals have escaped any major outbreaks of respiratory disease- only one heifer had to be treated for pneumonia since housing.

#### Calves

- The calves were weighed on the 11<sup>th</sup> December and given a fluke dose and clostridial booster vaccine on the 17<sup>th</sup> December. They are performing well.
- A few calves have become lame on the slats; these are treated and put on a straw bed until the recovered. They are then returned to their respective groups.

## **Grassland Management:**

- Soil sampling will begin in January. From this a nutrient management plan will be developed and paddocks selected for re seeding.
