

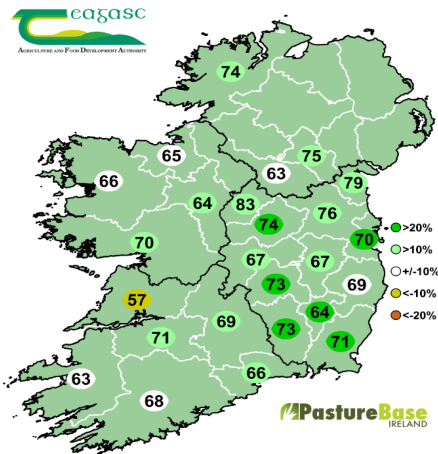

Today's grass growth (kg DM/ha/day)



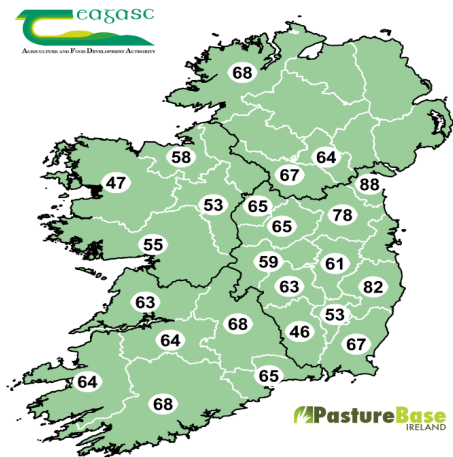
On the left: counties map showing **current** grass growth rates over the last week.

Building grass for the Autumn– What are your plans?

Dara Killeen–Eyrecourt, Co.Galway

AFC– 623 SR– 3.95 Growth– 99

“Grass growth still flying here at the minute, last of bales cut today so building for 1st September target cover of 950. Stocking rate will be high at 3.6 until reseeded ground comes back in mid September. I will use high quality baled silage to build AFC if needed. Paddocks cut for silage have received Protected N+ K”



Jim White– Clonmel, Co. Tipperary

AFC– 714 SR– 3.2 Growth– 60

“My stocking rate will drop to 2.65 before 1st Sept as silage ground comes back in which will reduce demand to 45 kg/DM/ ha. My target average farm cover is 800 on the 1st September. 2 paddocks to bale this week and then my attention turns to building grass. I have 9.8 tonne of grass grown per ha so far in 2020”



Autumn targets on Beef, Sheep and Drystock farms

“I'm extending the rotation to 25 days by the end of August. I'm currently working at 14 days of grass ahead and will extend this to 18 days by the end of the month. Cows are calving at the minute and I want good grass ahead of cows and calves in September”

- The winners of the competition from previous years may enter the competition in 2020.
