






- 1. We have 25 cows calved and milking in this group.
- 2. Average farm cover (AFC) is 965 kg DM/ha (420 kg DM/LU) which is above target (854 kg DM/ha, see graph below). We are now allocating 11 kg of grass and 3 kg of concentrate. We are grazing a mixture of heavy and light covers to ensure that we remain on track to get our target area grazed each week.
- 3. Growth rate last week was 26 kg DM/ha per day

- 4. Stocking rate is 2.32 LU/ha and demand is 25 kg DM/ha per day
- 5. We had 33% of the farm area grazed by the 1<sup>st</sup> of March which is on target
- 6. Pre-grazing yield is 1500 and we are allocating 11 kg DM of grass and 3 kg of concentrate per cow per day
- 7. 28% of the farmlet received 2500 gallons of slurry in January and 100% of the area received half a bag of Urea (23 units) in early-February. We will spread a bag of Urea (26 units) on 100% of the area this week.





- 1. We have 25 cows calved and milking in this group
- Average farm cover 705 kg DM/ha (307 kg DM/LU) which is below target (854 kg DM/ha, see graph below). We are allocating 6 kg of grass, 5 kg of silage and 3 kg of concentrate to try and hold farm cover and while still getting our target area grazed each week. Growth rate last week was 21 kg DM/ha per day
- 3. Growth rate last week was 21 kg DM/ha per day
- 4. Stocking rate is 2.32 LU/ha and demand is 14 kg DM/ha per day
- 5. We had 36% of the farm area grazed by the 1<sup>st</sup> of March which is slightly ahead of target

6. Pre-grazing yield is 1200 and we are allocating 6 kg of grass, 5 kg of silage and 3 kg of concentrate per cow per day28% of the farmlet received 2500 gallons of slurry in January and 100% of the area received half a bag of Urea (23 units) in early-February. We will spread a bag of Urea (26 units) on 100% of the area this week.

#### Whole farm update

- 1. We had 202 cows to calve this year and there are now 29 left to calve. There are 168 cows being milked. Five cows were sold after they calved.
- Cows are currently milking 20.7 kg/day at 4.89% fat, 3.24% protein and 4.78 % lactose. Milk solids per cow are 1.72 kg/day. Latest results from the processor 4.96% fat, 3.47% protein, 4.85% lactose and 136 SCC. Average bodyweight of milking cows is 499 kg and average body condition score is 3.06.

- 3. Average farm cover on the general area is 972 kg DM/ha (481 kg DM/LU). Demand is 23 kg DM/ha per day and growth rate on the general area last week was 20 kg DM/ha per day. Stocking rate is 2.02 LU/ha. We have 37% of the general area grazed which is slightly ahead of target. We have 60 general cows calved and they are being allocated 11 kg DM of grass and 4 kg of concentrate.
- 4. We let out the 44 maiden heifers on the 4<sup>th</sup> of February. They were 301 kg when we let them out to grass. However, we had to bring them in on the 20<sup>th</sup> of February due to inclement weather. We will let them out again this week.
- 5. The maiden heifers will receive their shot for BVD and lepto before they are let out to grass again this week.
- 6. We have 64 dairy heifer calves, 45 of those are on the automatic feeder and 19 are being reared on milk replacer in a separate shed. The remaining heifer calves are limousin and angus. To date we have sold 40 bull calves.
