

Sustainable Forest Management Ireland seeks to provide a broad, inclusive approach to certification in Ireland.




Mission statement:

SFMI has an interesting history.




Despite early expectations, certification is still going strong over 20 years later.

Option 2 – expand membership, progress certification awareness and standard development in Ireland


The Irish FSC Standard will expire in 2017.

From FSC International:

"Those countries, which do not have a registered standard development group will be depending on Certification Bodies developing Interim National Standards based on International Generic Indicators. Currently we are discussing advanced proposals with the CBs identifying which CB is taking up which country. According to current plan, Control Union will transfer the Irish national standard to an Interim National Standard, unless a chamber balanced Standard Development Group is registered."

Updated info (June 16): Soil Association now the CB appointed to this task

Revising the Irish (FSC)Standard requires a significant level of input in terms of expertise, time and resources.




PEFC Ireland is in a more 'stable' position.
