Investigations prior to EIP

Farmyards: 16 inspections – 3 direct discharges

Domestic Waste Water: 40 septic tank inspections – 16 failed, 6

directly discharging

Limitations to these inspections: Top-down, management etc








Catchment Area

- 1400 ha (<3500 acres)
- 16km watercourse
 - Curraghmore 010
 - Small stream
- 41 eligible farmers
- Free draining soils
- Ramsgrange village



Results based reward scheme

- 1. RISK the *number* of PPZ's (pollution potential)
- 2. RESULTS: Overall Farm-level *status* assigned (red, yellow, green)- management




