Data use and governance in the Irish farming and forestry sectors

Raising awareness and co-creating good practices

The AgriDISCRETE project explored the use of data in Irish farming and forestry, and is setting out a roadmap for further development of digitalisation and data governance in these sectors. Interdisciplinary researchers from the Walton Institute (ICT) and RIKON (business) in Waterford Institute of Technology, and Teagasc (social science) hosted a series of multi-actor workshops over two years with various agri-data stakeholders. These included farmers, food processors, technology providers, and policy-makers, as well as representatives from the forestry and farming sectors.
